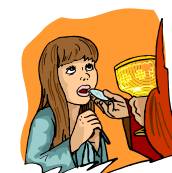
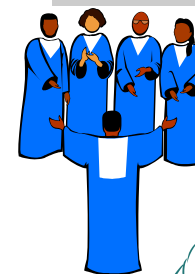

LITURGICAL MINISTRIES AT ALL SAINTS'



The purpose of All Saints' Church is to celebrate God's love, to seek and to serve Christ in all persons, and to go forth into the world rejoicing in the power of the Spirit.

There are a myriad of opportunities for parishioners to assist at church services.

ALTAR GUILD

The **Altar Guild** assists the clergy with reverent care of the altar and preparation of it for all services. It maintains the linens and vessels that are used. Members work in teams (usually once a month). Preparing a place for the Eucharist is preparing for a celebration: Decorating with suitable flowers, candles, banners, and setting the table with the best linen and dishes. Each familiar act gains significance before the Great Festival where Christ is with us in the breaking of the Bread.

ACOLYTES

All baptized youth nine years of age and older are welcome to join the Acolyte Guild. Acolytes assist at the preparation of the altar, head the processions, and play a leading role in the actions of worship. Most acolytes serve once or twice a month at the 10:15 a.m. service on Sundays and on major feast days. Acolytes also rehearse once a month and participate in fun activities like pizza parties and football games. At age 8, youths are welcome to join the guild as acolytes-in-training.
