We served 356 people this weekend. Thanks to Chris and Bob, who covered the Outreach Coordinator duties and to all of you who stepped into the rain to get food to our neighbors!

COMMUNITY...OURS

Our community continues to surprise me! I learned that the Friday Distribution Team started a book club! I haven't yet figured out how they read while serving groceries, but I'm going to join them! If you want to join this wild reading group, let Chris know!

LINK2FEED

We register people who come for food in Link2Feed (L2F), which is hosted by OFB. Through L2F, we gather basic demographic information about our neighbors. That data is critically important. It tells the hard-to-hear, but oh-so-important story about the relentless increase in food insecurity in our community. We hear the story about Oregon and nationally (Oregon Live article; OFB article). And it is occurring right here.

OFB uses the data to determine how much food we are allocated. So, as our numbers increase, we get the food necessary to feed people. And I use it for program planning, grant writing and communicating with our community. Hence, data integrity is of utmost importance. Our Intake Workers are working to update the data. This takes extra time and can add stress to their job.

Here's what their efforts have produced just this week. We track the number of households and the number of people in those households. Our data on people was incorrect. So, we've been updating it. And it's making a difference.

Last week, we served 156 households, this week 154. If you look at that data alone, you might presume we served fewer people. However, last week, we served 338 people, this week 356.

That's a difference of 18 people...18 people who can get food as OFB integrates the correction into their system, 18 people who tell the story of hunger in our community...

That difference most likely reflects our Intake Workers' efforts to clean the data. So, a shout out and thank you to our Intake Workers! The role you play is vitally important in getting food to our neighbors!

ADVOCACY

Even as we get food to our neighbors, we need to continue addressing the root causes of food insecurity. OFB is taking a lead in this for our state and invites you to join them. Please consider attending the OFB Community Briefing Event Statewide Organizing. They will provide an overview of how food banks and other service organizations are uniquely positioned to connect people accessing services to the decisions made at the local, state and federal level that impact them and their communities.
