PORTLAND'S SAFE REST VILLAGE MODEL HAS SHOWN SUCCESS HELPING PEOPLE GET PERMANENT HOMES

Portland's safe rest villages are small communities that offer around 30 to 50 tiny homes as transitional shelter for people who had been homeless. Each unit has a bed, a locking door and a heating and cooling system. Villagers share bathrooms, showers, laundry facilities and a kitchen. The sites are staffed with case workers and housing navigators, many of whom have experienced homelessness themselves.
