
# **Woodstock Pantry ENews Brief**

### **DEMAND CONTINUES TO SURGE**

Each week this month, more people came to the pantry. We broke last week's record, which broke the previous week's record... I don't know what is causing this particular surge, but I do know it's one of a succession of surges that we witnessed this last year. The steady increase in demand impacts our entire operation.




A Bit of History The pantry was born as a response to the pandemic. It, quite literally, was a 'pop-up' operation, complete with a temporary storage container and a community dedicated to fighting food insecurity in our area. Our community includes all of you, All Saints and businesses/organizations in our area. All Saints covers the pantry budget, which includes a small stipend for a part-time Outreach Coordinator and overhead costs for building use. We rely on the rest of our community for all else.

**Bags** In the last months, we increased the number of dry and produce bags we make from 125 to 140 and next week, to 150. Additionally, we serve 150 Options bags and 20 Ready-to-Eat bags. Not surprisingly, we experienced a bag shortage.



So, we put out a call to our community. The response has been nothing less than phenomenal! The picture to the right shows all the bags donated just this weekend. The picture to the left shows our current cache of bags. My goal is that people will make it a weekly practice to bring bags. Back to our story...



**Volunteers** Volunteers on every shift are doing more work. And more volunteers are required to cover every shift. So recently, I increased the number/shift on the signup sheet.

### PORTLAND PUBLIC SCHOOL STRIKE

<u>Oregon Public Broadcasting</u> Members of the Portland Association of Teachers last week voted overwhelmingly in favor of a strike should contract negotiations in Oregon's largest school district fail to yield an agreement soon. The <u>union gave notice</u> to Portland Public Schools on Thursday, Oct. 19 that they would begin striking on Nov. 1.
